What is considered EFMP?



Each EFMP enrollment is determined on a case by case basis. The enrollment process is initiated at the EFMP Medical Office. EFMP families may have members who experience physical, intellectual, emotional, or developmental disabilities that require special attention to include counseling, therapies, treatments, special education and training. Some of our EFMP family members have special learning conditions, while others may have medical conditions like asthma, autism, cancer, seizures, PTSD and many more. For children, they may require an IEP or a 504-Plan to facilitate them getting appropriate assistance/accommodations in order to thrive in the school system. Ultimately, EFMP enrollment is determined by medical professionals in conjunction with the EFMP Medical Office.



Who We Serve

The EFMP Family Support Office assists all ID-card holders with at least one special needs family member (adult or child).

ID-card holders include active and retired members and their dependents from all branches of service, including Reserve and National Guard members and their families, along with DOD employees and contractors. We are non-medical case managers who are here to assist you with a variety of needs.
